Description of change/improvement that would impact fair registration outcomes:

Introduction of Limited Competency Assessment Fee (\$250) to cover the costs required to allow applicants for Associate Membership with a limited scope of practice to undergo a competency assessment through the OPFA Registration Committee and become licensed without being required to undergo the National Credential Assessment Process (CAP) - which not all applicants are eligible for. All Annual Membership Fees increased by 5% to account for rising costs. The Annual Provisional Member Fee for Provisional Members who do not meet the registration requirements within the provided 6 years to become licensed and remain as Provisional Members on extensions was raised from \$100 to \$310 (50% of the Full/Associate Membership fees). The goal is to encourage individuals to work through the requirements and become licensed instead of stalling out as Provisional Members.

Provisional Members struggling to build a network & connections in different fields and gain relevant experience, especially newcomers to Canada and those from families not connected to forestry. Introduced the Shadow a Forester Program to provide opportunities for Student and Provisional Members to network, learn about different jobs and gain experience and develop their professional networks.

A lack of awareness that professional forestry is a regulated profession in Ontario, and what that means. Communications strategy developed in 2022, with both print and web-based communications materials to be developed (ongoing work).

Applicants from an increasingly wide range of backgrounds, many of whom do not meet the competency requirements for Full Membership. Worked on raising awareness of Associate Membership as a more flexible option, open to those who may not be eligible for assessment through the Credential Assessment Process (CAP) for Full Membership and sharing this information through webinars and orientation sessions.
